## This call to action is live from January 2025 through June 2025.

**Background and Directions:** The Food Bank Coalition of MA (consisting of the Food Bank of Western MA, the Merrimack Valley Food Bank, the Worcester County Food Bank, and GBFB) is advocating to fund <u>Massachusetts Emergency Food Assistance Program (MEFAP)</u> in the FY26 state budget at \$55.5M. We need your help in advocating with your State Senator, State Representative, and the Healey-Driscoll administration to protect and strengthen MEFAP funding.
